Blagrave Play Area, Reading Borough Council

Project Highlights:

- New surfaces designed for ease of access and movement
- Ground-level trampolines
- Basket swings and swing units (including one fully supported seat)
- A ground-level roundabout fully accessible to wheelchairs

Project Background

The existing equipment in the playground had reached its end of life and the council saw the opportunity to replace each item in the play area. The playground consisted of two play areas aimed at different age groups.

The theme of the play area was based on the history of the explorer John Blagrave who the park was named after. In the decision making process of what children wanted in a play space- HAGS had understood the brief.
