

Chiltern Way Academy, Buckinghamshire

With a great new school opened for primary aged children, Chiltern Academy recognised a need for climbing and swinging equipment and HAGS provided the right solution.

A need for vestibular and proprioceptive stimulation

Chiltern Way Academy recently opened as a new school for primary aged children with behavioural issues. It was established early on that the pupils would need somewhere to climb and swing on the school site and 3 companies were asked to provide proposals for the site.



A close liaison with HAGS resulted in a carefully planned proposal which matched the school's needs closely, fitting in with both their budget and ideas.
